■ OLOC Fell Walkers

Our Lady's Fell Walkers have two walks on **Saturday 10th January 2026** from the medieval cathedral city of Chester. Both walks are flat the A Walk a brisk 12 miles walk around the outskirts of Chester and the B walk following a similar path but only 7.5 miles. The A walk is faster and higher, and the B walk lower and slower.

We are a friendly group and everyone is welcome. The coach leaves from the corner of School Lane and Church Road, Formby, at 8am on the day and you can book your place by ringing 01704 878548. There is always an early stop for coffee/tea/bacon barmes and time after the walk to visit shops, cafes and pubs in the area. Thank you so much, everyone, for your generosity and support over Christmas. The Foodbank staff were particularly grateful for all the tins of potatoes that people rushed out to buy in response to their emergency appeal. They tell us that, apart from Tesco, our parish is their biggest donor of food week by week. We have now banked and distributed everything you gave us over the Advent and Christmas period, and this is how it worked out: The Foodbank for Christmas £700; St. Joseph's Sisters in Kenya contribution (little brown envelope collection) towards an X-Ray machine for Health Centre £860; Christmas carol singalong at Tesco and Waitrose, with Churches Together, for local homeless and hospices £936.

A message from the President

It hardly seems possible that it was a year ago that I wrote informing you I was to become the new President of our Conference. To say that time flies is an understatement. This year saw a change to our collecting regime, with SVP collections being incorporated into the 2nd collections. The amounts raised have been gratefully received and this has enabled us to continue with our work.

We have continued supporting the Foodbank, the Soup Kitchen (*grateful thanks to the Rotary Club of Southport Links who provided £300 to cover 6 months of costs in providing the weekly batch of sandwiches*), the Sisters of Mercy, refugees in Liverpool, plus the National appeals for South Sudan and Ukraine, as well as our twinned parishes in India and South Sudan. Pinned on the notice board is a letter received from one of our twinned parishes—St John the Baptist's conference in Karamuck. This is located in the state of Kerala in the South West corner of India.

So, on behalf of our members may I thank you most sincerely for the generous donations that you have made during this past year. We have certainly put the money towards funding very worthy causes.

Apostolic Exhortation **DILEXI TE** of the Holy Father **LEO XIV** (taken from opening chapters 4 and 5 - To all Christians on love for the poor)

4. Jesus' disciples criticized the woman who poured costly perfumed oil on his head. They said: "Why this waste? For this ointment could have been sold for a large sum, and the money given to the poor." However, the Lord said to them in response: "You always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me" (Mt 26:8-9,11). That woman saw in Jesus the lowly and suffering Messiah on whom she could pour out all her love. What comfort that anointing must have brought to the very head that within a few days would be pierced by thorns! It was a small gesture, of course, but those who suffer know how great even a small gesture of affection can be, and how much relief it can bring. Jesus understood this and told the disciples that the memory of her gesture would endure: "Wherever this good news is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in remembrance of her" (Mt 26:13). The simplicity of that woman's gesture speaks volumes. No sign of affection, even the smallest, will ever be forgotten, especially if it is shown to those who are suffering, lonely or in need, as was the Lord at that time.

5. Love for the Lord, then, is one with love for the poor. The same Jesus who tells us, "The poor you will always have with you" (Mt 26:11), also promises the disciples: "I am with you always" (Mt 28:20). We likewise think of his saying: "Just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40). This is not a matter of mere human kindness but a revelation: contact with those who are lowly and powerless is a fundamental way of encountering the Lord of history. In the poor, he continues to speak to us.
