The Parish Pastoral Council – A message from Fr John

At its final meeting at the end of last October, the Parish Visioning Group identified two areas that should form the focus for pastoral action in our parish; family life, with outreach to the young, and care of the bereaved. It was clear that a more permanent group was needed to steer and develop these two objectives, with the intention of having a clear plan of action by the end of this year.

In the first place, I want to thank everyone who attended the meetings of the Visioning Group. It was a group open to all parishioners and those who attended showed a real desire to see our parish come together and move forward. It has taken some time to reflect on what kind of permanent grouping is now needed to help carry the Visioning Group's objectives forward, its shape and membership.

A new Parish Pastoral Council has now been formed. The legacy of the Visioning Group is clearly seen in the word 'Pastoral'. It is a group of vision, outreach and mission, which takes as its first agenda the objectives mentioned above. At its launch, it will consist of members nominated by me. I have wanted to achieve two things. Firstly, to ensure continuity, I have asked some of those who attended the Visioning Group to serve. Secondly, I wanted to strike a balance of different ages and backgrounds and take the opportunity to introduce 'new' faces. The members of the new Council will serve for a fixed term and in due course a nomination process will be introduced so that future members will be nominated by the parish.

Family life with outreach to the young and care of the bereaved will now be looked at in detail and a plan of action drawn up in the months ahead. Out of these discussions will arise wider issues, but the emphasis is now very much on action. The new Council will report back to the parish regularly and will be seeking to work with members of the parish across the board, to seek advice, to listen and to encourage.

Finally, in all that we do as a parish, we keep before us the one who is the beginning and end of all our hopes and aspirations, our listening and action, our plans and our work; the Risen Christ. His is our purpose, our ultimate plan and our constant focus. To him we commit our efforts and hopes, with the desire that many will come to know and love him.
