

# **Parish Notices**

#### ■ The Gild Hall

As announced at last week's Masses, the Archdiocesan Parish Centres Management Committee, having concluded their internal business consultation, have decided that the business is no longer viable. The Trustees of the Archdiocese confirmed this decision and trading ceased on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> August 2025. The three staff members have been made redundant. There will now be a period of winding down of the business and the removal of their assets. It will be some time before the future of the building becomes clear.

### Ordination of Andy Dell to the Diaconate

This will take place in the Cathedral on **SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 6th AT 12 NOON**. We have booked a 53-seater coach in the hope that a good number of parishioners will take the opportunity to attend this very special event in the life of our parish and among our community.

Leaving at 10.30am prompt from The Gild Hall and returning at approx 3pm or shortly after from the Cathedral, the cost will be £8.50 per person. Costs will be adjusted if numbers or the size of the coach need to be changed.

# ■ Important Updates: Live Streaming & New YouTube Channel

We know many of you have appreciated our live streams of Mass and other events. To continue offering this valuable service, especially for those who are unable to attend in person, or exploring our faith, we've made some important updates in line with new guidelines.

#### 1. Changes to Live Streaming

We've made a few adjustments to ensure your comfort and privacy during our live streams:

- What We're Streaming: We'll continue to live stream every 11:00 AM Sunday Mass, along with special feast days or occasions when an operator is available.
- Where to Watch: All streams will be publicly available for replay for up to three months after the live event.
- Privacy & Seating: Members of the congregation are not focused on during the streaming but may be visible at the times as the cameras follow the Mass. If you prefer not to be visible on camera, you'll notice new signs at the church entrances. These will identify designated "off-camera" seating areas. Separate arrangements are being made for Ministries of the Eucharist, Liturgy and Music.
- **Communion Privacy:** During Holy Communion, to respect personal privacy, the stream will display only church settings and the Archdiocese of Liverpool Spiritual Communion Prayer.
- Children's Consent: Children under 16 will only be shown on camera if we have parental consent. If consent isn't given, parents are responsible for ensuring their children remain off-camera.
