

The Parish of Our Lady of Compassion, Formby Consultation on the future of St Jerome's Church

The Parish Pastoral Council of Our Lady of Compassion, Formby initiated a parish wide consultation regarding a proposal that the Church of St Jerome be taken out of sacred use.

The consultation began Saturday 28th October 2023 and concluded Saturday 12th November 2023. A total of 19 emails and 5 letters were received by the Council and these were read and considered at an extraordinary meeting, held Tuesday, 14th November 2023.

The Council noted that the total number of responses were very low, particularly in the context of an average weekly attendance of 450 across three Masses of Sunday.

The Council was thankful for the generally constructive feedback from those responding. Of particular note, were those responses demonstrating a real care and concern for our Parish Priest and Deacons. There was considerable acknowledgement of the burdens placed upon our clergy in serving the community and in some cases a very real desire to see that burden reduced through the need to minister in multiple places of worship. Some response also reflected a very strong feeling that the Church is much more than the buildings we use.

Almost all respondents acknowledge a sense of inevitability that St Jerome's Church would close. Some expressed resentment that this was a foregone conclusion and questioned whether this was true consultation.

All acknowledged a very real sadness and sense of loss or bereavement at the prospect of such a closure. In recognising this sadness, a number of respondents also saw this as a positive step forward in bringing the Parish together as a single community seeking to build a future together. Some responses reflected on opportunities for greater ecumenism and an opening up to a spirit of renewal.

Several of the respondents did not share this optimistic view and felt that should St Jerome's close, there would be a negative impact on the community. Some reflected a preference for, what they perceived to be, a less traditional and more accessible liturgical environment in St Jerome's. Concern for older parishioners was a strong theme in responses and the challenges that might be presented in travelling to Our Lady of Compassion Church. There was a very real pastoral concern for the need of St Jerome's school and its proximity to the Church. Consideration was also given by the potential impact in worshipping numbers given housing developments in Formby.

Parking being readily available at St Jerome's, as opposed to more informal parking arrangements at Waitrose supermarket, was highlighted as a factor the retention of St Jerome's over Our Lady's.

Nearly all responses considered the economic realities highlighted in the consultation document provided to parishioners as part of the process. Some readily accepted these as a sound rationale for the closure of St Jerome's. However, others disagreed with the interpretation and argued that the costs associated with running a more modern building like St Jerome's would be more affordable than costs associated with the older Our Lady's building.

Several respondents sought assurances around whether or not a Saturday evening Mass would be reprovided at Our Lady's should a decision be taken to remove St Jerome's from sacred use. In the event that St Jerome's might close, a very real concern was expressed that items of liturgical and community significance be taken through to Our Lady's so as to honour and celebrate the heritage of St Jerome's.

Significant interest was expressed in potential community use of the St Jerome's buildings should a decision be taken to take the Church out of sacred use. Potential use by St Jerome's school featured in several responses. Underpinning this interest was a wish to understand how such activity might be financially supported.

In considering all feedback, the Council noted that any potential closure of St Jerome's Church presents a large number of practical issues that need to be worked through sensitively. However, the consensus was very clearly that none of these should be beyond the abilities of a community genuinely wishing to grow together in a spirit of love for God and each other. The witness of former St Anne's parishioners in embracing a new future was highlighted as a source of great learning and hope in how we might move forward as a parish.

The Council remains convinced of the validity of the economic considerations outlined in the consultation document and also notes that none of the responses set out any practicable alternative to the proposal under consideration.

The Council believes that the best possible future for the church in Formby is to gather as a single community around one altar and unanimously recommends that St Jerome's Church should be taken out of sacred use.
