■ Families of Parishes

The Archbishop has now determined that for our Deanery there will be two Family of Parishes, splitting the Deanery into the North and South. The Deanery Synodal Council are keen to consult with all parishioners about the Family of Parishes and importantly, how we respond to a challenge from the Archbishop for us all "to build relationships and develop communications" in our Family of Parishes and our Deanery.

■ Livestreaming of Masses

In the early days of the pandemic Deacon Joe Moreland arranged for a livestreaming system to be installed in St Jerome's Church. This enabled the livestreaming of Masses for the parish whilst the Church was closed during the lock down. When Fr John was appointed as Parish Priest of Our Lady's, Deacon Joe arranged for a livestreaming system to be installed in Our Lady's Church. At first, all 3 parish Masses were livestreamed regularly as the livestreaming system was operated by Deacon Joe. Obviously as his illness progressed, this was no longer possible. We now have the kind services of a parishioner who livestreams the 11am Mass on Sunday morning most weeks. This is the main parish Mass and in our changed circumstances, this will be the only Sunday Mass to be livestreamed going forward. We owe Deacon Joe a debt of gratitude for setting up this system, running it and training our parishioner to operate it. The livestreamed Masses have helped many and hopefully will continue to do so with the livestreaming of our main Mass when it is possible.
