At the request of the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, Mass will be celebrated for the King and Royal Family on the eve of the Coronation on Friday 5th May at 10am.

Mass Intentions

The people of our Catholic Community are very generous in asking for Masses to be offered for various intentions and especially for their loved ones who have died. Recently we have had a backlog of almost 60 Mass intentions waiting to be celebrated. Since Fr John may only offer 1 Mass intention per day and given that there is a maximum of 5 that he may celebrate in any given week, the backlog always lengthens quickly. Parish priests are requested to retain only those Masses that can be celebrated in a reasonable period of time. Therefore, here in our parish, the number of Mass intentions handed in are too many for Fr John to celebrate. It has been our custom to send Mass intentions to priests who receive none. We have been sending most to the priests at Mill Hill who for many years have supported our Catholic Community in the provision of Masses. They have expressed their deep gratitude for this generous gift. We are aware that this is a sensitive area and that people would like the Masses to be celebrated in their Parish Church. Nevertheless, we hope you will understand that this is not always possible.

Going forward, we shall now print in the newsletter, an acknowledgement of receipt for each Mass intention we receive. This will reassure the donor that we have received the intention and the accompanying offering. However, this provides no guarantee that the Mass will be celebrated in the parish.

OLOC Fell Walkers

OLOC Fell Walkers will be walking from the ancient village of Hayfield in the Peak District on Saturday 13th May 2023. The A walk is 9.5 miles and 1950ft and follows some of the route taken by the 1932 mass trespass walkers to the Kinder plateau - an important step in the creation of the Peak District National Park and future rights to roam. Our walk starts from Hollingsworth Head and crosses Burnt Hill to the Pennine Way and onto Kinder Plateau. We walk along the edge past Kinder Downfall and Kinder Low. There are good views across the Goyt Valley and over to Chinley and Manchester. We return to Hayfield past Kinderlow end and Edale Cross. There are generally good paths and few stiles, though the walk across Kinder Plateau is quite rough, with plenty of rocks and boulders to negotiate. Walking poles would be useful.

The B walk is 7.5 miles and 1400 ft. The first part of the walk follows the Sett Valley Trail to Lantern Pike. This was the track bed of a railway that until 1970 linked Hayfield with New Mills and Manchester and is now a pleasant tree lined haven for wildlife. We walk past Lantern Pike and then along quiet country lanes. Crossing the busy Glossop road we climb to Middle Moor with good views over to Kinder and then return to Hayfield along the Snake Path. Paths are generally good, though there are some rough sections where care is needed, mud and a small ford to cross towards the end of the walk. Hayfield has a couple of good pubs at the end of the walks, The George and The Packhorse and tea shop Rosie Lee is open till 4.00. The village will be in festive mode as it's the annual May Queen Festival this weekend, so there's likely to be a lot of bunting about!

We are a friendly group and everyone is welcome. The coach leaves from the corner of School Lane and Church Road, Formby, at 8 a.m on the day and you can book your place by ringing 01704 878548. The A walk is a higher, faster walk and the B a lower, slower walk. There is always a stop for coffee/tea/bacon barms etc., on the way out and time after the walk to visit local cafes, shops and pubs. Please wear weather appropriate clothing and boots and bring a packed lunch. Sticks are also handy if you have them.



After all the hard work by a small but dedicated team, we are now looking forward to 3 days of community events. We just need to tie up a few last things ...
