Parish Development Review Our Lady of Compassion Formby part of the Deanery of Sefton North

This attachment will appear regularly on the Parish Newsletter, to fully inform members of the Parish of the Parish Development Review Process and the ongoing status of the buildings, that form the Parish Estate.

Our Lady's Presbytery (Formerly the Convent)

Our Lady's Presbytery, formerly the Convent, has had a long history. Built in 1688, it was originally intended to be the first Church for the Catholic community of Formby. The collapse of the reign of the Catholic King, James II and the 'Glorious Revolution' of 1688 put an end to that dream. The building was used for various purposes in the years that followed, including use as stables. With the passing of the Catholic Relief Act 150 years ago, the building was finally used as a church and became the place of worship for Catholics until the building of our present church in 1864.

After that, the building was taken out of commission as a church and eventually became a Convent in 1930 until the departure of the nuns in 1999. Fr Bernard took over the house as his Presbytery until his retirement in 2020. Fr. John continued to live at St Jerome's after his appointment as Parish Priest of Our Lady's. Our Lady's Presbytery was surveyed by the Archdiocese and it became clear that the cost of the renovation would be prohibitive. Fr. John was given the use of a diocesan house in Rosemary Lane as a temporary solution.

At the end of 2022, the Trustees of the Archdiocese decided that the number of vacant buildings across the Catholic estate after the merger of the three parishes was too high. The decision was taken to sell St. Anne's estate, and when the time was right, to sell Our Lady's Presbytery. St. Anne's estate has been sold and now Our Lady's Presbytery has been put on the market.

St Jerome's estate still remains empty and it remains on the Trustees' agenda. The Archdiocese is now looking urgently at all empty properties because of the increasing cost of maintaining unused buildings, particularly the extremely high punitive rates that Councils are charging for them. Last weekend, Fr John wrote a long message to the Parish about the new Parish review that is being launched in the three Sefton deaneries and the future shape of our parishes and buildings. What we are seeing in our own Parish is now beginning to take place elsewhere. As the review gets underway, we will hear more about the process.

St Anne's Presbytery Church and Hall

The St Anne's Estate has now been sold. The land was given on a legal reverter clause by the donors of the land, the Weld Blundell Family in 1928. Once the church ceased to exist, the land was to revert to the original donors. They have now received the full proceeds of the sale of the land. The Parish has not benefited financially. We are not aware of how the new owners will develop the land, that will become clear over time.

St Jerome's Presbytery Church & Hall

The Trustees of the Archdiocese are aware of the Parish Estate at St Jerome's. There are certain challenges relating to the proximity of the school. As of now no decisions have been made and it is unlikely that any decision will be reached in the near future.
